# President's Letter January 2013 from Gary Barnhart—Our New President

Greetings, thought I'd share something about myself for those who do not know me. I'm 54 and have been married 32 of those. In '76 I started a career in engineering during high school (as a detailer) and managed to keep a toe in it 18 of the years since, ending up as a project manager, that ending Dec. '99. From '78 to '84 I worked at ITT Grinnell as a metal trades journeyman, the hot forge dep't and the welding dep't being two main areas. The experience was priceless, that no college could ever give, in making me a better designer. In '00 I opened my shop "SteelTree Workshop." ## **Double Hook with Decorative Leaves**

From a design by Don Pfaff And edited by Jeff Nau

Start with a 1/8" X 1/2" X 6" bar stock

6" long



Draw out a short taper

Fuller to begin the leaves

Cut from both bottom fullers inward, along the inner line, leaving a space uncut in the middle

Draw out and shape leaves

| 3/16 hole | Shape any way you like—one can be a hook and the other a curly queue |






